

IACKSON COUNTY

- In 2012 there were approximately 2,851 business establishments.
- 8,276 job postings in 2012.
- **59,097 people** worked in Jackson County in 2012².
- 55.3% of residents live and work in Jackson County.

- 59.5% of the workforce lives and works within Region nine.
- There were 48,797 job postings in 2012.
- Approximately 20,027 business establishments exist in Region nine.
- **424,043 workers** across the region.
- 127,978 workers who live outside the six counties commute into the region for work
- 155,205 residents in the region commute outside the region for work.
