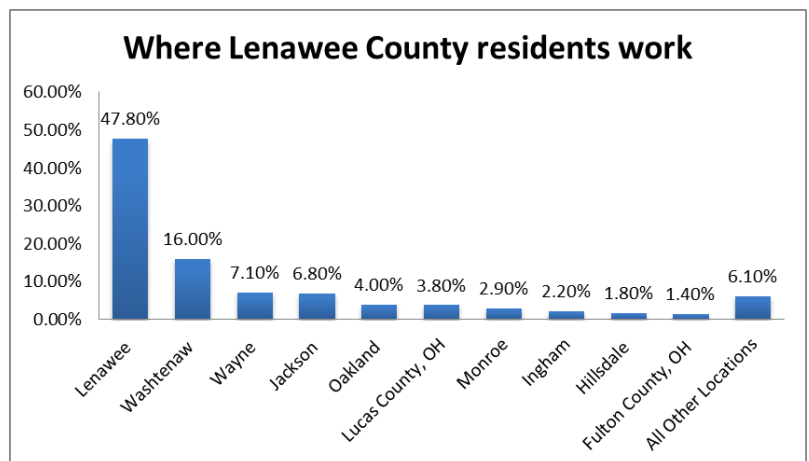


Region 9 economic development labor shed

The labor shed in MEDC's Region 9 highlights why, when it comes to talent, we must think regionally: Our workforce is mobile. Although **59.5% of the region's workforce live and work¹ in a nine-county area**, not all residents work in their own county. It is not uncommon for workers to commute one or two counties over for work. This means that the residents in Lenawee County should be ready for the job demands of employers hiring throughout the region.

LENAWEE COUNTY

- In 2012 there were approximately **1,859 business establishments**.
- **3,347 job postings in 2012**.
- **31,009 people** worked in Lenawee County in 2012².
- 47.8% of residents live and work in Lenawee County.
- Lenawee County is a **commuting community**- 17,007 Lenawee residents (52.2%) work outside their home county.
- 9,094 workers are employed in Lenawee County but live outside its borders.
- 11.7% of residents travel more than 50 miles to go to work.



REGION NINE³

- 59.5% of the workforce lives and works within Region nine.
- There were 48,797 job postings in 2012.
- Approximately **20,027 business establishments** exist in Region nine.
- **424,043 workers** across the region.
- 127,978 workers who live outside the six counties commute into the region for work
- 155,205 residents in the region commute outside the region for work.
